These students are first generation college bound high school students, that have been identified by school officials as having an extreme need, (displacement, homelessness etc.) Students apply and receive laptops fully equipped with Windows 7.

The Gloria Washington Wallace Young Leaders Technology Scholarship is awarded annually to first-generation high school graduates in Howard County, Maryland. Student recipients of the scholarship will be awarded funds based on their scholarly achievement and a written essay on how they would use technology to solve a social problem. This scholarship seeks to provide young people with college aspirations the tools necessary for success.

SOCIAL INNOVATION

TRIANGLE SOCIAL INNOVATION ACADEMY

Through a partnership with IBM and American Underground, RemixEducation's TSI Academy takes a cohort of 15 - 20 students through an intensive entrepreneurial discovery and venture development program. Facilitators help students develop innovative business ideas that make life easier, help us communicate better, or address a social problem that affects us every day. At the conclusion of the camp, students pitch their venture ideas to a panel of entrepreneurs. Winning pitches receive seed capital for their business ideas and mentorship from triangle entrepreneurs. Recent winners created an employee-owned food truck for single mothers called "Cell-a-Plate".

MENTORING

H.E.R. STORY PROGRAM
"HELPING EMPOWER REGALNESS"

The H.E.R. story, project is a one- to-one mentorship program for at-risk high school girls between the ages of 14-18 in three urban locations: Washington D.C., Atlanta Georgia, and Durham, NC. The program exposes at risk girls to various post-secondary opportunities. Activities include but are not limited to personal esteem building, proper mannerisms and workplace etiquette, resume creation, the college application process, domestic violence, sexual health and numerous community service opportunities. Mentors consist of trained and vetted young professionals and local college students. Currently, the program serves over 45 mentees and 30 mentors. This project addresses the need of African American teenage girls at-risk of becoming detrimental statistics such as high school dropouts or engaging in risky behavior. The girls in most cases would be first-generation college students and come from communities with high crime and high levels of poverty.

HELPING EMPOWER REGALNESS



Many students have been referred due to academics. We have seen the following outcomes: 100% high school graduation, 100% admitted into a post-secondary institution, an improvement in student overall GPA by at least one letter grade and an improvement in overall student academic self- concept. In our first year of our program, 100% of program participants graduated from high school and 100 % were admitted to a secondary institution. We recognize the unique pressure today's urban teens face; drugs, sex, online bullying, etc. Students without stable home lives are less likely to have advocates in their corner urging them to graduate.

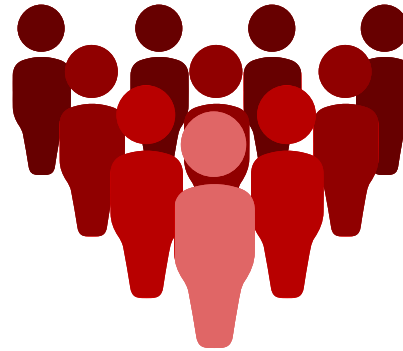

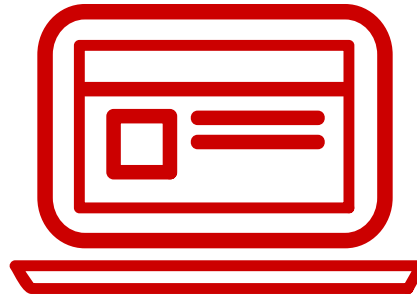

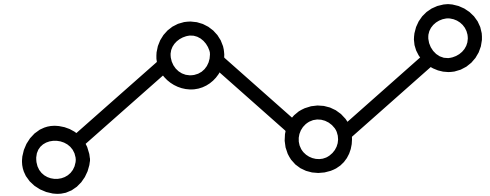

Shayla Adams is a 28 year- old student advocate from Columbia, Md. She is the CEO and Founder of RemixEducation an education training organization which serves over 100 students in Maryland,Georgia, Washington D.C. and North Carolina through positive youth development programming.

Upon graduation from Wellesley College in 2008, Shayla went to Duke University to pursue her Master of Arts in Teaching Degree. Currently, Shayla is a U.S. History Teacher at Phelps High School in NorthEast Washington D.C. where she combines her love for learning and teaching with A unique project-based learning model.

Shayla is Committed to ensuring that all children regardless of race or background have access to a quality education. This year she was granted the CityBridge Education Innovation Fellowship in which she is conducting a Blended Learning Pilot in an attempt to redesign the 9th grade ELA experience at her school.

Shayla began RemixEducation in response to what she describes as “a realization that millennials wanted to enhance their communities but seemed disconnected.” She began the scholarship program as part of her desire to help first-generation students achieve success their first year of college. For her work in the State of Maryland, she was named as the 2013 Capital Cause Changemaker of the Year, and was listed as one of 9 Young Guns in Howard County to watch by political website, The Seventh State.

Internationally, Shayla has served as Director of Operations for Global Learning an education for Justice program. She has led programs in Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Mexico for hundreds of children in their public schools. She recently published her first book, Making College Happen, which is a how to guide for first -generation college students attempting to navigate the college application process.
