HHMI's Summer Undergraduate Research Program promises to be an enriching experience for students, fostering scientific discovery and professional growth.

## **Eligibility and Application Process**

The program is open to current undergraduates in good academic standing who are US citizens, permanent residents, DACA, or authorized to complete a paid academic internship in the US under visa or work authorization terms. Recent graduates are not eligible to apply. HHMI does not sponsor visas for this program.

All interested undergraduates must complete an application to confirm eligibility, provide basic personal information, and describe how participation in the program will support their professional goals.

HHMI will accept applications from May 1 to May 21. Interested individuals are strongly encouraged to apply as early as possible.
